## General Terms:

- All students must have a completed physical within 30 days of application submission.
- Application deadline with applicable deposits are due March 1, 2011 however spots may not be available to those who wait this long to apply. Please see specific terms by camp for deposit and refund rules. Terra Lingua USA requires a non-refundable deposit of \$50 with application.
- Final tuition payment must be received no later than April 1, 2011 with the exception of Camp Mohawk Equestrian and senior program where final tuition is due by March 1, 2011.
- Program costs include transportation, TLUSA Fees and Medical Insurance.
- One-week pure homestay programs may also be available at the end all camp programs for an additional \$300. Please ask well in advance if this is something you are interested in.

Chinqueka is a private sleepaway summer camp for girls located on Mt. Tom Pond in Litchfield, CT. Our camp philosophy is simple – comfortable girls are happy campers. Camp Chinqueka boasts a beautiful lakeside setting on Mt. Tom Pond in the rolling hills of Connecticut's Litchfield County. Campers stay in one of 14 cabins on the premises. Campers that attend Chinqueka get to know the caring and experienced staff. 2 counselors live in each cabin with the campers. All of our cabins are wood sided and have toilets and sinks. Campers shower in one of the central shower houses. Kid-friendly and nutritious meals are served family style in Chinqueka's spacious dining hall. Counselors dine with and supervise the campers at each meal.



**Camp Awosting**...a traditional sleepaway camp for boys on Bantam Lake in Connecticut... run by the Ebner family for over 60 years.

Awosting is a traditional summer camp full of happy campers, mature, experienced and safety-conscious staff, and activities practically guaranteed to make a boy's summer more fun! Camp Awosting boasts a beautiful lakeside setting on Bantam Lake in the rolling hills of Connecticut. Campers stay in one of 16 cabins on the premises. Two counselors live in each cabin with the campers. All of our cabins are wood sided, carpeted and have toilets and sinks. Campers shower in one of the central and private shower houses. Meals are kid-friendly and nutritious. We eat family style in Awosting's spacious dining hall. Counselors dine with and supervise the campers at each meal. In addition, we have special theme buffet dinners throughout the summer, many with our sister camp, Chinqueka.

Both camps offer tutoring in any elementary or high school subject at standard professional rates, and may be arranged upon request. In addition, tutoring in ESL (English as a Second Language) is available for their many international campers.

The tuition rates include medical insurance sponsored by Terra Lingua USA, TLUSA fees, camp accommodations as described in the brochure, all regular camp activities, awards and trips, and such items as laundry, craft materials, daily candy and soda snack, and one camp shirt. An additional charge is made for horseback riding instruction and trail rides. Transportation arrangements to and from camp for campers and their baggage are the responsibility of Terra Lingua USA.

Parents will also be asked to deposit an extra amount to the camper's canteen account to cover purchases of any personal incidentals, such as soap, toothpaste, stationery, flashlight batteries, postage stamps, etc. Linen rentals are available for a small fee.

No reduction can be made for late arrival or early departure. The directors and/or Terra Lingua USA reserve the right to sever a camper's connection with the camp at any time if deemed in the best interest of the other children. No refund can be made for withdrawal or dismissal. In the case of campers who, as a result of accident or illness incurred at camp, are absent from the camp for more than two weeks of the season, the loss of tuition will be shared with the parents.

**Application Deadline March 1<sup>st</sup>.** Non-refundable deposits listed above must accompany the application. Please apply early as spots fill quickly! Final payment is due no later than April 1, 2011

Non-arrival of camper(s) on opening day (of any camp period) without prior notification will result in a 100% forfeiture of tuition.

In addition, wire transfer fees for refunds will be paid by the sending organization.

Parents enrolling their children are understood to accept these conditions.
